**BEGINNING IN 2012,
VOTERS WILL BE REQUIRED TO SHOW A PHOTO ID AT EVERY ELECTION
OTHERWISE, A BALLOT WILL NOT BE ISSUED**

**IF YOU ARE ELIGIBLE TO VOTE, BUT DO NOT HAVE AN ACCEPTABLE PHOTO ID,
AND WILL BE 18 YEARS OF AGE ON THE DATE OF THE NEXT ELECTION,
YOU MAY OBTAIN A FREE PHOTO ID (FOR PURPOSES OF VOTING,) AND THE \$28 FEE WILL BE WAIVED.

ACCEPTABLE ID'S

Wisconsin DOT-issued Driver's License

Wisconsin DOT-issued ID Card

An unexpired Driver's License or ID Card RECEIPT issued by Wisconsin DOT

Military ID

US Passport

Certificate of Naturalization, issued within the last 2 yrs.

ID card issued by a federally recognized Indian Tribe in WI

An unexpired ID Card issued by a Wisconsin-accredited university or college that contains date of issuance, student signature, and an expiration date no later than 2 yrs. after the date of issuance. To use as proof of residence, a current document showing proof of enrollment must be shown, or your name must be on the list of current students provided by the university.

QUESTIONS AND ANSWERS

- (1) The address listed on the photo ID does not need to be current and match the address on the poll list. However, proof of residency will be asked for.
- (2) You can use an expired photo ID if it is dated before the date of the last November election (11/2010).
- (3) Election inspectors will verify the name on the photo ID matches the name on the poll list, and that the photograph resembles the voter. (If Robert is on the Drivers Photo ID, but Bob is on the poll list, this is acceptable.)
- (4) Voters exempt from showing a photo ID:
- (a) Military or overseas voter(one who is permanently abroad) who votes by absentee ballot.
 - (b) Voter w/confidential listing, but may show a confidential ID card or provide inspector w/name and confidential ID Serial Number (e.g., domestic abuse).
 - (c) A voter who is indefinitely confined because of age, physical illness, disability, or infirmity, and who has qualified for an absentee ballot may submit a statement with their ballot signed by an individual who witnesses them voting to verify their name and address are correct.
 - (d) An absentee voter who resides in a nursing home, or other care facility where special voting deputies are sent may submit a statement with their ballot signed by the special voting deputies to verify their name and address are correct. When special voting deputies are not sent, a statement may be submitted with their ballot signed by an individual who witnesses their voting, verifying their name and address.

(5) IF A VOTER DOES NOT PRESENT A PHOTO ID, THEY WILL BE OFFERED A PROVISIONAL BALLOT TO VOTE. IN ORDER FOR THEIR VOTE TO COUNT THEY MUST TRY TO PROVIDE A PHOTO ID BEFORE END OF THE ELECTION DAY, IF POSSIBLE, BUT CAN PROVIDE THIS PROOF TO THE MUNICIPAL CLERK, NO LATER THAN 4p.m. ON THE FRIDAY AFTER THE ELECTION.

NOTE: Provisional voting is a lengthy paperwork process.
All attempts will be made to secure a voter ID from every registered voter.
