

PREFERENCE VOTING

Party Preference Vote and Presidential Preference Vote

For the Spring Election, April 3, a voter has one of the two choices above to vote Presidential:

(1) If the voter selects Party Preference, all candidates for that party will receive a vote – either all Democrats and all Republican candidates. You will not be able to cross party lines. If you do, your vote will not be counted.

(2) If the voter does not want to vote for all Democrat or all Republican candidates, then the voter should select Presidential Preference Vote.

General Election for President, November 6, 2012:

**ACT 23 eliminated straight party ticket voting.
Voters must choose candidates individually.**

For all elections, a voter can no longer use a corroborating witness.
