

Town of Morgan 2019 Annual Meeting Minutes

Chairman Fran Wranosky called Annual Meeting to order at 7:30pm. Pledge of Allegiance was recited. 15 present and 4 elected officers.

Motion by Dave Behrend/Debbie Wranosky approved 2018 minutes read by Town Clerk. M/C.

Motion by Sherry Peterson/Bob Peterson approved 2018 Treasurer's Report presented by Town Clerk. M/C.

Julie Belongia/ Town Clerk introduced the 2018 Annual Financial Report by being simple and easy to understand the numbers; Recycle Center brought in \$15,263.55; election staff was busy with 4 elections; Town Road maintenance spent was \$173,562.56; Land Use planning Commission met 5 times in 2018; Morgan municipal Cemetery 2018 had 2 burials, 3 lots were sold; Total Income for the town was \$482,825.71 and Total Expense for the town was \$400,541.62

Oconto Falls Area Joint Ambulance Service Squad Members

Patrick Ahlgrim and Angie Ahlgrim are new directors. Angie gave an introduction of her and her family. **Training-** Refresher training every 2 years (big expense) and state requires it, Stop the Bleeding Training Program, and Active Threat Training. EMS coordinator and trainer are very important. Recap 506 calls, 30 people 1st responders and would like more volunteers especially in Town of Morgan area.

Fundraising- Annual Fundraiser in December, close to our goal of purchasing a new Power Cot, and hope to make the acquisition before the end of the year.

Ryan Raatz/R&R Assessing Ryan Raatz present a report reviewing sales in our area. It was a sellers' market. Re-evaluations done last year, cleaning up from market evaluations, and noted the town was in compliance with the major class comparison. Date was set for Open Book Review May 20, 2019, from 9-11AM and Board of Review date

was set for June 11, 2019, from 9-11AM. No statutory changes. Thank you for your time.

Building Inspector, David Enigl, was not present to give a report.

Leonard Wahl/Fire Chief/President talked about Pulcifer Station, which is up and running this year, however shortage of personnel during the day between the two townships. 2011 truck has been paid off with the Capital Funds. Fund raiser is the Annual Fire Picnic Aug 10, 2019. Some of the old equipment needs to be replaced or additional is needed. Purchases has been made and keep on working on getting more and better equipment. 26 calls last year: auto accidents, fire calls, and one grass fire. Training every month on the 3rd Tuesday of the month. We work with the DNR on wild fires/grass fires. 3 new people starting their initial training classes. 28 people on the roster and still need more from Morgan area.

Fran Wranosky/Town Chairman talked about the following items: black topped Havlik Rd, made it through 30 plus inches of snow April 14 and April 15, numerous calls on removal of branches blocking roadways during wind storms, new fence put up for the brush pile area in April, increase in snow removal \$38,000 plus this year, town E911 signs/new road signs are complete, calls on garbage in ditches, complaints regarding planting in the road right-of-way, and broadband tower northeast part of township by Bertram Wireless Service.

Public Comments: ATVs results- At this time ATVs can only cross County Roads. ATVs are not allowed on County Roads in our township unless there is an agriculture sticker. For the town of Morgan, at this time no roads are open to the ATVs.
