

Chairman Fran Wranosky called meeting to order at 7:00 PM. Pledge of Allegiance was recited. 34 present and 5 elected officers.

Motion made by Shirley Kazmarowski/ 2nd by Debbie Wranosky dispense from reading April 26, 2021 annual minutes and be approved as typed. All in favor. M/C.

Cindy Smith/ Treasurer went through the Account Reconciliation 2021 consisting of the following account balances: A) General Account \$896,902.66 B) Escrow Account \$5,200.00 and C) Capital Funds \$8,688.76. Total General Property Taxes \$1,657,444.99. Total Morgan Tax Settlement paid \$1,490,694.64. Difference is the town's levy approximately 8.99% of your property taxes comes back to the town. Total Levy is \$167,213.00.

Oconto Falls Area Joint Ambulance Service Squad Members Angie Ahlgrim and Pat Ahlgrim did a presentation on the full-time service of the Ambulance. Community support from all municipalities has been good. The presentation was very good with details of what the full-time ambulance service has been doing and improving the service to the community. Ryan Raatz/ R&R Assessing Ryan Raatz stated the value rating and 2021 was 93%-94% and this year has gone down to 91% to 89% due to being a seller's market. However, we are still within the state compliance. No evaluations for this time and no statutory changes.

Building inspector, Dave Enigl, was not present to give a report.

Morgan Cemetery, Randy Birr- We have a memorial donation for the cemetery, and are currently looking to replace the signage at the cemetery. My hope is to have maintenance free signs. My efforts in 2021 continually ran into dead ends. I will keep working on this. Activity at the cemetery was steady through the year. There were 23 contacts with various people who had questions comments or concerns, along with the burial planning. There were 5 traditional burials and 1 cremation burial for the year. 4 lots were sold at the cemetery this year. No new headstones placed in the cemetery. One tree removed for a burial. Grass was cut 13 times in 2021 and 12 times in 2020. The contracts for Sexton, Opening/Closing of graves, Landscaping and General Maintenance are in place for 2022. I'd like to thank the people of the Town of Morgan and the Town Board for the privilege of maintaining the Town Cemetery.
